FORM 5 - FARM STEMTERPRISE - As part of this years Science Week Form 5 are taking a closer look at Farming. Farming STEMterprise projects take children through each stage of setting up a farm shop business: considering seasonality when deciding which crop to grow, growing their own ingredients, calculating expected profit, designing responsible packaging and much more.

This week began with looking at the different crops grown in the UK and identifying some of the crops the children have grown themselves, with the aim of creating a Maldon Court Farm shop selling the produce and plants they will grow.

The children looked at the different types of seeds under a microscope including a green bean, garlic clove and seed potato – comparing their differences and similarities.

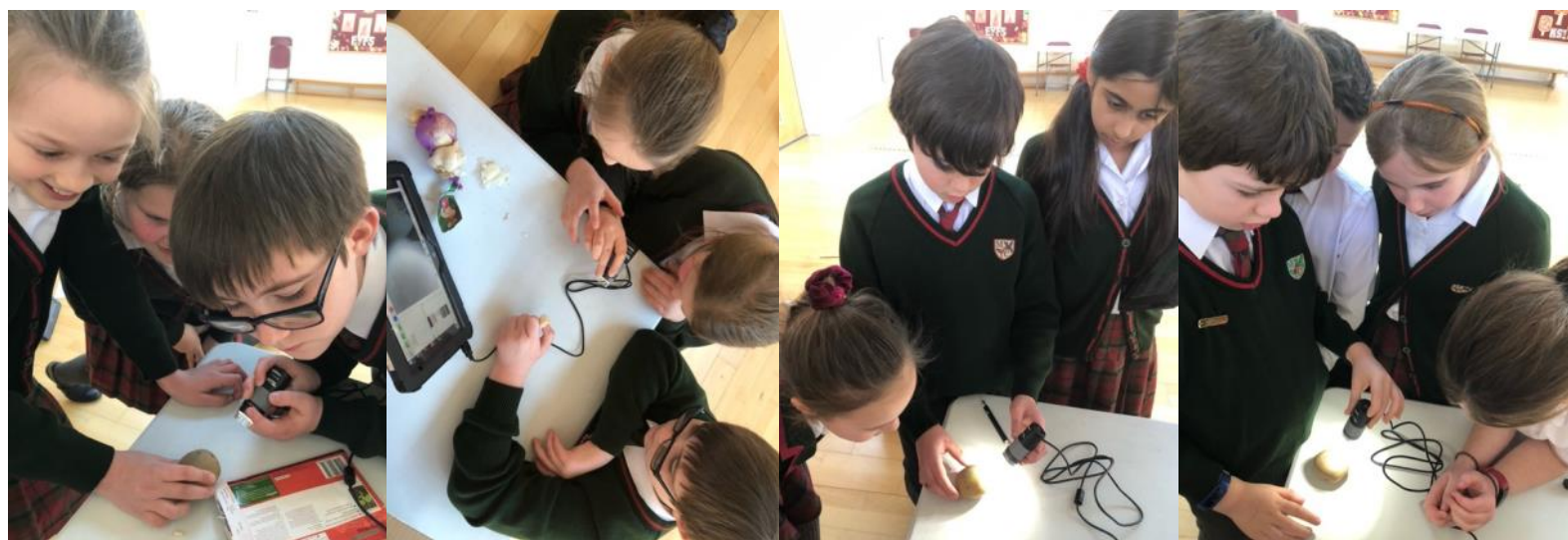
They researched how to grow their chosen crop and identified the care and attention it would need in order to grow healthily.

Over the next few weeks the children will continue this project ready to start sowing before the holidays.

FUTURE FARMING ROBOTS - Form 5 continued their Science Week Farming theme with a look at Future Farming Robots. In this lesson the children were considering the importance of soil in farming – including ensuring soil is healthy, not compacted by heavy machinery and suitable for growing particular crops.

They learnt how robots are being created by innovative engineers to help reduce weeds in an environmentally safe, organic and cost effective way. This led to the development of a robot that could identify weeds based on their size and removing them through laser technology zapping the weeds.
