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MATHS DAY

Nursery - Nursery had a fun little Maths table on Monday! It included number books, counting blocks while making them into a tower, matching numbered dominoes, a number clock and some 2D, laminated hedgehogs with a certain amount of pegs they had to put on! During their break time, children were asked to match the dominoes. It looked like they were enjoying it a lot!

Pre-Reception - Pre-Reception had Maths spread out across the entire day. In the morning they stuck down shapes to make a beautiful Easter chick! On one of the tables, it had questions of how many objects were drawn and they would have to put a wooden disc with a number on next to the questions. During the afternoon, they went for a number hunt! The teachers would hide numbers with sparkly slime in it and Pre-Reception would have to find it. What a fun filled day they had!

Reception - Reception had an afternoon of 'Marvellous Maths'. They had a range of activities. Firstly, they were matching the tops of eggs (with counters on) with the bottom of the eggs (with the equivalent number on). Also, they made chicks with shapes, but these were laminated shapes. Sadly, they couldn't take it home. Finally, they used multilink blocks to measure each other in groups but one person in the team has to be counting how many blocks long they are. Zaiden said he was "loving it!"

Form 2 - For International Maths Day Form 2 enjoyed learning through play. They had many activities going on at once; exploring mass, capacity and building.

SCIENCE DAY - To celebrate Science week, each class undertook a number of exciting experiments. Pre-Reception watched the reactions of bicarbonate of soda and vinegar; Reception made 'Magic Milk', they added food colouring to milk and then enjoyed moving the colours around when they added washing-up liquid; Forms I and 2 did a number of timing investigations, Form 3 investigated the amount of friction on different surfaces by measuring the distance a toy car could travel and then investigated whether the amount of cocoa in chocolate affects the rate it melts at; Form 4 carried out a reflex investigation and a pendulum experiment, testing whether the length of string on a pendulum altered the number of swings it would make in one minute, Form 5 did 'Smashing Stereotypes' in Science and participated in a live lesson and Form 6 also did some pendulum experiments. Great fun was had by all!



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FORM I - Form I had a fantastic trip on Monday where we went on an adventure to Abberton Reservoir. We started off the day talking about the different seasons and the signs, I was extremely impressed with all the knowledge the children had remembered from our previous science lessons. We then went on a scavenger hunt around the Reservoir to find different signs of Spring. Along the way we were able to identify different types of birds and trees. We built some very interesting looking nests for the birds we had found and played a migration game, where we understood what this meant for birds such as Sparrows who do not enjoy winter at all in this country. After lunch, we had a very exciting opportunity to go pond dipping and as you can see from the photos below, the children absolutely loved this exercise! The children were then given the opportunity to look through a magnifying glass to identify the different pond creatures they had come across. We found invertebrates such as blood worms, pond snails, tadpoles, water hog louse and many many more! We all had such a fantastic day exploring nature and the muddy puddles that came with it (sorry parents). The children were a real credit to Maldon Court with their impeccable manners and scientific knowledge, well done Form I *Miss Vaughan*
