SCIENCE WEEK- FORMS 5 & 6 - Last week for British Science week the Form 5 and 6 children arrived to discover a classroom filled with: a sneezing landing strip, water pistols loaded with coloured water, glitter, soap, oil, tissues and measuring equipment. In small groups they were challenged to plan various enquiries to answer their questions including recognising and controlling variables. They simulated sneezing and measured the breadth and distance of each sneeze. They discovered how effective tissues were at blocking the sneeze. They used glitter, oil and soap to show how quickly germs can transfer onto other surfaces and that cold water washing isn't very effective at getting rid of germs. Great fun and learning was had by all.
