NURSERY MATHS DAY - Nursery had a focused activity using the 'compare bears'. We counted them and discussed the sizes and colours. The children had to find the correct colour and size bear to complete the pattern.



PRE-RECEPTION MATHS DAY - Pre-Reception enjoyed engaging in a repeating pattern tuff tray. The children used the 2D shapes to continue the set-out patterns. They then had a turn at completing their own patterns, some children used two shapes and others used three.

We also went on a shape hunt in the classroom, looking for items that were different shapes and sizes and placing them on the tray in the correct space, some children found large items and other children picked small ones.

FORMS 1 AND 2 MATHS DAY - For Maths Day, Forms 1 and 2 had a lovely morning trip into Maldon town. We sat on the benches in the sunshine and completed a survey on the different colour cars that went past. We thoroughly enjoyed this exercise and collected our data by using a tally chart. Once we completed this, we came back to school, analysed our results and presented it on a bar graph. The children loved this activity and enjoyed working with different scales and discussions on interpreting their data as well. Well done everybody!

FORM 3 AND 4 MATHS DAY - In Forms 3 and 4 Maths Morning, the children had to predict and then investigate whether there would be a relationship between pupil height and shoe size. Before we started our investigation, we discussed the distinct types of 'correlation' and predictions were made on the results. First, the children had to measure one another and then find out their individual shoe sizes. Once the data had been collated, the children then worked together to create and present their data within a scatter graph. This concept is not covered in depth within lower key stage 2 and all children worked extremely hard to present their data neatly and accurately. The children were able to recognise that there was a 'positive correlation' between the results of pupil height and shoe sizes. Well done Forms 3 and 4 for a wonderful morning of statistics.
