**NURSERY** - It has been a very exciting week in Nursery! The children have loved our Science Topic and have been enjoying pretending to create some experiments in our role play science lab. The children made salt pictures and were fascinated to sprinkle salt and then food colouring to see what the reaction would be. We set up a science tuff tray and the children explored this, pouring coloured water into beakers and test tubes. Next week, this topic continues. **PRE-RECEPTION** - We have had a lovely week in Pre-Reception and we have started our new Spring topic. The children have enjoyed exploring our new planting station. They have planted peas, carrots (which we hope to one day eat for snack time), sweet peas and calendula flowers. We have had class discussions about what our plants need to grow, and we've had some lovely suggestions. We have also completed some observational paintings of daffodils and we learnt the parts of the daffodils such as stem, petal, stigma, and the cup. We have also carried out a coloured flower science experiment where we had white Carnations in water and added different food colourings. We made predictions of what would happen to the flowers and observed them over the day which was very exciting! We learnt this reaction happens because plants drink water through their roots which then travels up the stem to the flowers.

















FORMS I AND 2 - This week, Forms 1 and 2 went to Chelmsford Cathedral. We had a lovely day learning about the Easter Story and looking round the Cathedral. We split into groups and took part in small workshops led by volunteers who were very knowledgeable and kind. We asked and answered lots of questions and some of us counted over 1000 crosses in the cathedral. As always, the children were very well behaved and a real credit to themselves and the school.
