It has been another fun and busy week at school. The children have all been working exceptionally hard. On Tuesday and Thursday we held our Parents' Evenings. Our song of the week was Humpty Dumpty, we focused on this rhyme over the week and enjoyed a range of learning opportunities linked to this. During physical time we pretended to be Humpty Dumpty and 'fell off' the wall by sliding down the big soft slide. We also introduced the children to positional language, discussing over, under, in, out etc. The children all coloured their own Humpty to stick on the wall! We spoke about it's significance and the elements of the poem that we thought stood out. We then used this and turned it into a 'blackout poem' where the children picked words that they wanted to stand out. We then drew poppies over the poem and painted the rest black. The results were beautiful and the children should be extremely proud of their art work. Well done Form 3!



FORM 6 - Form 6 have had a wonderful start back to this half term. Now the 11+ examinations are over, we have really enjoyed broadening and enriching our curriculum. We have been looking at War Poetry in English, focusing initially on the soldiers situation in Dulce Et Decorum Est. In DT we have begun our textiles project, looking at different materials as well as how items of clothing and bags can be joined and embellished. The children have also thoroughly enjoyed practising their sewing techniques and creating a sampler. We are using our map skills from Geography in our History lessons and are beginning to plot out local places of interest ready for our walking tour of Maldon. The class have thoroughly enjoyed studying the local history around us and have even discovered a Nobel Prize winner was born in Maldon. We have also started our Genius Projects. The first topic was Rainbows and the pupils produced some really diverse projects, from mythology, to science, LGBTQ+ and the COVID-19 pandemic. *Mrs Bradford and Mrs Summers*
