

SCIENCE WEEK - FORM I - Form I have enjoyed experimenting during science week this week. We carried out an experiment to discover how quickly bacteria and germs can be spread between us. We mixed some lotion with some glitter and one person used it on their hands. We then shook hands with each other and by the end, we all had glitter on our hands representing bacteria. We were very surprised by the results and how quickly a cold or virus could spread! We then wrote this experiment up for our science books. Miss Sackett

FORM 3 - For British Science Week Form 3 and 4 teamed up to investigate 'Is everyone's body the same?' Firstly, with a partner from a different form, they created a life-size drawing of each other, they then worked together to draw detail like hair, eyes and nails. Next, working in groups of 8 they were given a set of different bones that they had to place on the bodies they had drawn around, there were bonus points for scientific labels! Lastly, with our teams of 8 they took some time to investigate how everybody is different. They measured the wingspan of each other, height, leg length, eye colour, hair colour and foot length and then compared results. We all concluded that although our bodies are alike in some ways, there is no one else in the world who looks quite the same as you, we are all different.

SCIENCE WEEK - FORM 2 - Form 2 carried out several investigations along the theme of Diversity. We started by taking a good look at one another and celebrating our similarities and differences. We then drew around each other and measured our height, the length of our legs and our arms. We also created Bottle Biomes; you can see these on our windowsill. We have been amazed to find that within a week many of our seeds have germinated. One investigation we did try that was not quite as successful was to find out what sort of 'taster' we are. This involved coating our tongues with blue food colouring and counting our fungiform papillae, not as easy as it sounds!





MATHS COMPETITION - On Thursday 4 pupils from Form 6 took part in an Essex Maths competition against 4 other local primary schools. The theme of the competition was 'Code Breaking Spies' and took the form of 4, 15 minute, timed tasks. The tasks required the children to work as a cohesive team solving a wide range of mathematical problems to locate spy dead letter box co-ordinates, solve algebraic conundrums, identify key codes and unlock devices. To add to the pressure of the timed tasks they were also limited in the resources they could use, only having two rulers and two calculators per team.

After an extremely tense and nail biting 2 hours Maldon Court were announced the winners of this heat and they are through to the finals which take place in the Summer term. Well done! Mrs Clark
