FORM 5 - This week Form 5 visited the Combined Services Museum in Maldon. During the visit the children took part in 3 activities linking to their History topic - World War 2.

The children learnt about war time rationing looking a some of the foods that were available and the portion sizes that were expected to last them a week and how they could grow fruit and vegetables as part of the 'Dig for Victory' campaign to help boost their food supplies. They found out about clothing rations which clothed people for the year and how 'Make do and mend' meant that clothes would be passed down through the family when children grew out of clothes or had to be mended if they were torn.

The second activity explored the life of the Cockleshell heroes who were able to render the harbour of Bordeaux useless after brave commandos canoed their way 60 miles up the Gironde River to plant mines on enemy ships.

Finally, the children discovered what life was like during air raids and how people would keep themselves safe in homemade shelters, escaping to underground train stations in London and following rules such as adhering to the blackouts in order to prevent the enemy from using landmarks to bomb England. The children had a fabulous time and Mrs Clark and Mrs Bonner as always were impeccably behaved.
