FORM 6 - On Monday, Form 6 went to Maldon Stadium to attend the Crucial Crew workshop. This is an event organised by Maldon District Council for Year 6 children about to transition to secondary school. This year's event dealt with the growing problem of children being exploited by the county lines drug organisations. Up to twenty-seven thousand children are thought to be involved in the UK, and Essex and Suffolk are high on the list of affected areas. The children watched a play that tells the story of Paul, a new Year Seven who is manipulated by older children into carrying and delivering drugs. They then took part in a workshop where 'ouch' moments were identified - hints that all was not what it seemed. They were also coached how to have conversations with an adult or friend if they or a friend was in trouble and needed help.
