FORM 5 - Before the Christmas holidays Form 5 set up an experiment to test whether you could reclaim salt from a salt-water solution as part of their Materials topic. The children carefully mixed salt into some luke-warm water, continuing to add until no more salt could be added, they identified this as a saturated solution. The solution was then poured onto 2 plates and placed on the classroom windowsill for the duration of the holidays.

On Form 5's return we found that all the water had evaporated and left behind some perfectly formed square salt crystals. The class also discovered that one plate of salt solution had evaporated faster than the other, as it was in the sun for longer, so the salt crystals were much smaller as they did not have time to grow before the water evaporated.
