

FORM 6 - On Wednesday, Form 6 had their final practical science lesson at The Plume. Over the last three weeks the class have had an introduction to a physics, biology and chemistry lesson held in a laboratory and learnt how to use the equipment safely and correctly. The science department saved the best till last and wowed the children with chemistry. The children learnt how to identify the different parts of a Bunsen burner, describe the different Bunsen burner flames and explain when each should be used and finally explain the steps involved in the safe operation of a Bunsen burner. Once this knowledge was secure, they were allowed to burn a strip of magnesium and observe how the flame changed colour. The class also managed to fit in a final practical, learning how to isolate salt from salt rock using filtration and evaporation. Mrs Fleming
