NURSERY - The children are really enjoying our topic 'Stories, Songs and Rhymes'. This week we have been focusing on the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. This has been a wonderful opportunity to enhance the children's knowledge on size ordering and this was supported with a sticking activity involving the three bowls. We also enjoyed a Goldilocks tuff tray, the children loved exploring this and using the puppets. We put on our own puppet show in the pod, the children were very good at making up their own stories. PRE-RECEPTION - Pre-Reception have really enjoyed their life cycle topic the past few weeks. The children have been engaging in many themed activities and have been waiting patiently checking daily to see if there had been any changes in our butterfly habitat.

This week has been very exciting, on Tuesday the children were thrilled to come into class and see butterflies emerge from their chrysalis. They then created observational paintings of the butterflies, sitting in groups at the table looking closely at the patterns and colours they could see on the butterflies and painting them independently.

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FORM 5 - Over the last few weeks Form 5 have been developing their Stop Motion skills. Firstly, they watched short clips of Wallace & Gromit and also Morph (taking Mrs Clark back to the 1980's!). They then spent some time getting to know the features of the Stop Motion App. They also learnt how to move the objects to make them appear as if they were moving, altering the distance they moved to change the speed of the movement and also how to record audio to add sound to their films. Then the children had to create a short storyboard telling their own story before planning the scenery and props they would need before filming commenced. FORM 5 ROAD SAFETY - On Tuesday Form 5 took part in a Road Safety Workshop. During the session they learnt about the Green Cross Code – reminding the children to STOP! LOOK! And LISTEN! They discussed the different safe places to cross a road and how to use each crossing safely. They also learnt about the stopping distance of cars at 30 mph in normal conditions and how the weather can affect the distance a car can stop.

Then the children went out on to Silver Street and Cromwell Hill to put their knowledge into practise. Each member of the class (including Mrs Clark) had to demonstrate how to cross a road, with care, on a straight, clear road and at a junction.
