FORMS 5 AND 6 - In Design and Technology, Form 5 children have been learning how to include a wide variety of vitamins and minerals into their diet. They have sampled a range of salads and investigated their nutritional value. The children have also been learning how to slice vegetables using the bridge and claw grip. Miss Reeves has really enjoyed sharing her skills and expertise with the children.

In Form 6 the children have been learning about the cardiovascular system. We started by investigating what cells form blood. We simulated this by making a blood smoothie. We used raspberries to show the red blood cells, marshmallows to represent white blood cells apple

juice made excellent blood plasma and finally sprinkles to show our platelets. We discussed how we all have different blood types and added oranges or bananas to show the antigens in our blood. This activity generated a lot of discussion and investigation into the roles of each of these cells and our smoothie tasted great.
