Dear Parents,

This week, many of our children in Forms 4, 5 and 6 have been participating in their English Speaking Board Exams. This prestigious examination is something that we are exceptionally proud of at Maldon Court. Mrs Deakin, our ESB specialist, works incredibly hard to prepare the children for their examinations and I would like to thank her for all of her hard work and dedication to achieving the very best for all the children who participate. I am delighted to say that Maldon Court are already streets ahead of the latest government recommendations. Last week the new Education Secretary, Damian Hinds, in his first conference speech said "Teaching children how to build character resilience and workplace skills is crucial for a thriving economy. 

**PARENTS' EVENINGS -** We are trialling the ParentMail system whereby parents book their own appointment slot with their class teacher via the Parentmail module titled 'Parents Evening' (pictured). You are able to book appointments with your child's class teacher as well as Mrs Holden (PE). Parents' Evening dates are: Tuesday 27th February, 3.45 - 6.00pm and Thursday 1st March, 5.00—8.00pm. Self-booking will go live for parents via ParentMail on Monday 5th February at 9.00am and appointments will be booked on a first come, first served basis. Please ask in the school office if you need help with this.

**BIG GARDEN BIRDWATCH** - This week the whole school took part in The Big Garden Bird Watch. Each child observed the birds that visited their garden in one hour over the weekend, these results were then recorded in a variety of ways in class. In Key Stage I the children found different ways of reading and displaying data including pictograms, bar charts and frequency tables. Form 4 have been reading and interpreting data in order to answer questions relating to the information the have collected. The pupils in Forms 5 & 6 focussed on data analysis, identifying where the observations were made and comparing the results

from different locations including Maldon, Witham, Danbury and Burnham. From the data collected they were able to establish that the more coastal locations and countryside offered a greater variety of bird types, up to 24 different types of bird, compared to town locations with a few as 11 different types. Form 6 went further in their analysis by comparing the different characteristics of the birds they observed such as those which liked to travel in flocks like starlings and those which were more solitary such as wrens.
