The excitement is building towards the end of term and all of the wonderful days and activities that have been planned for the children. On Friday last week, Forms I and 2 were lucky enough to have specialist hockey training at Maldon Hockey Club. The children had a fantastic time and we are very grateful to the hockey coach and also Mr Kingston who gave up their time to provide the children with this wonderful experience. Their next hockey session is on 7th July. Pre Reception have enjoyed a fabulous trip to the Gruffalo Trail and Form I visited Hyde Hall to complement their Science curriculum. To top off a wonderful week, some of our extremely talented children showcased their musical abilities in last night's soiree. This was a wonderful event which was thoroughly enjoyed by all who attended. On Monday, the children will be participating in Transition day where they spend the day in their new classroom with their new teacher. This is always an exciting day for the children. I would like to welcome Alex Willey who has joined us in Form 2. He has already settled in extremely well and I know that you will make the family very welcome into the Maldon Court family. HEADTEACHER'S AWARD - Well done to Brodie Clampin who has achieved a Headteacher's Award this week for being so helpful around the school.

FORM I TRIP TO RHS HYDE HALL - On Tuesday 27th June, Form I went on a Science trip to RHS Hyde Hall as part of their topic on plants. The children found out why plants are so important in our lives and the important part bees play in the pollinating process. They were able to look at seeds from all around the world, make their own seed pot out of paper, plant their own seed, draw and paint flowers and examine the nests and bones of animals found in the grounds of Hyde Hall. The children were given the task of creating their own birds nest and then had to identify the sound of some common birds they might hear in the garden. The children looked at art work from the famous Land Artist Andy Goldsworthy and created their own temporary picture using petals and leaves. Form I had a wonderful day and the workshop leaders at Hyde Hall were very impressed with how the children listened so carefully, their behaviour and their standard of knowledge about plants and birds.










PRE RECEPTION - On Wednesday, Pre Reception had a wonderful day exploring The Gruffalo Trail at Thorndon Country Park. We followed the paths which took us around the 'deep dark wood' and found all the characters from the story. The children had great fun climbing, balancing and jumping in the woods. We found lots of dens and collected sticks to make them bigger. We then enjoyed a lovely picnic lunch. As always, the children were a credit to Maldon Court School. Thank you, Mr. Hilton and Mr. Fleming for helping us to build dens, collect sticks and have so much fun.





the true beauty of its nature. At first we looked at the natural wonder of the coral and the vast species of wildlife including nearly 1500 kinds of fish, even Finding Nemo, the Clownfish! The children discovered that the smallest fish is

called the Stout Infant Fish which is only 7 millimetres long, and the biggest is the whale shark which can grow up to 12 metres long. The children produced wonderful posters and studied the on-going threats to this Natural Wonder. The children found many different causes both human and natural. The worst natural danger to the Great Barrier Reef is the Crown of Thorns starfish, which eats the coral until it dies. The children were very mature at explaining if one ocean species dies out, it has a huge effect on the reef's delicate food web. As a class we discussed ways that we could solve the problem. Well done Form 3, I know you are good at looking after the environment.

ESB EXAMINATIONS - Well done to the children in Forms 2 and 3 who have taken their ESB Examinations this week. I was pleased to see an array of picture boards and props coming into school for the children to present their talks to the examiner. Well done to all those involved and a big thank you to Mrs Deakin and all her hard work in preparing the children once again.

PARKING - Last week I had a meeting with Richard Holmes, Director of Community Services at Maldon District Council and Karen Bomford, Group Manager of Community Services, regarding our campaign to get parking permits for parents for September rather than using the pay machines. The meeting was very positive and as we have already said, parents are happy to pay for permits but on a user pay principle rather than paying for when we are not using the car park. This has been a long consultation process with the Council and many meetings have been attended to reach this stage. The final two meetings are on 4th July for Community Services meeting and then the Full Council meeting on 13th July. Both meetings are at 7.30pm and will be held at Maldon District Council offices.
