**PARENTMAIL** - Further to our message sent out during the week please make sure you are using the latest version of the ParentMail App on your mobile devices.



**NURSERY** - This week, Nursery I and 2 have been enjoying the topic: Transport and Road Safety. We made a rocket out of a big box and flew to the moon! We also did some mark making with pens attached to the cars. The children have enjoyed learning about road safety and making good use of the car and train track. Next week we begin our topic: Christmas. For optional homework, please make a decoration at home to display in Nursery.



FORM 2 - The children in Form 2 have been excited for the start of making their cars. This week they are designing and they have begun to saw the wood for the chassis. In maths they applied their measuring skills to accurately measure the wood in centimetres. Once measured, the children were very safe using the tools correctly and no fingers were lost in the process!



















**FORM 3** - On Tuesday, Form 3 had a fabulous day at Braintree Museum. The trip was to support their History studies about World War II. They had a lesson in an old classroom with a very strict teacher, they had to stand when they addressed her and call her 'Ma'am'; Mrs. Baron is thinking about using this approach! They also had to write on slate, sing the National Anthem and take cover under the desks when the air raid siren went off. They also role-played being evacuees and what it may have felt like to take cover in an Anderson Shelter during an air raid; the sounds and darkness were quite scary. In the afternoon, the children were able to try on uniforms from different services. They were very surprised to see how small they were, a result of not enough food.



**FORM 4 -** On Tuesday Form 4 visited Braintree Museum and took part in workshops about the Roman Empire. The children investigated real Roman artefacts including pottery and jewellery and then tried to identify what they were used for. They dressed each other in togas, they made Roman coins and shields. The children learnt about what daily life was like for the rich and poor people and acted out a role play of a market scene, in which they had to barter for goods that they wanted. This was a very lively activity. The children had a fantastic time and their behaviour was impeccable.
