ESSEX AIR AMBULANCE TRIP - On Wednesday, twelve children had the wonderful opportunity to visit the Essex Air Ambulance base at Earls Colne. This was an incredible day where the children had a once in a lifetime opportunity to meet the doctors, pilots and all of the Essex Air Ambulance support team. The children had the chance to meet Dr Fenton who was busily showing them all of the kit inside the ambulance car when an emergency phone call came through! The doctors had to rush to the emergency in their car (cloud cover was too low for the helicopter to take off). This gave the children an opportune time to speak to the pilots of the air ambulance and they asked many interesting and valid questions. They were also allowed in to the helicopter! This was an enthralling day for everyone involved and I would like to say a special thank you to Dr Fenton (Jamie and Florence's dad) for his help in facilitating such a memorable trip.











KS2 ART CLUB - Our Key Stage 2 Gifted and Talented Art Club have been experimenting with various painting techniques. This week we have looked at Jackson Pollock and have been trying to create our very own splatter art landscapes. We started by painting a landscape in water colour and we're slowly building up splatters to create some beautiful wild flower scenes.





SCIENCE - This week the children in Forms 5 & 6 took part in a live science lesson hosted by the BBC. The lesson focussed on 'What happens to the food we eat?' The children took part in activities which identified how much water we are made of, which food groups certain food belong to and how nutrients are extracted from the food as it travels through the intestines. The children will also be taking part in lessons in class to identify whether they are non-tasters, tasters or super-tasters!



The children in Form 6 have analysed the types of birds seen in different locations, making predictions, comparisons and finally drawing conclusions about what their data revealed.
