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## **WORLD BOOK DAY 2022**



#### **LIFE SUPPORT ROADSHOW FORMS 5 AND 6**

On Monday Forms 5 and 6 attended the life support roadshow to learn about first aid and how to save someone's life. We were taught by instructors about different life- threatening scenarios and what to do in them. We were taught to first assess the situation for danger, then how to phone for help and what information we would need. We were taught how to check if a casualty is breathing by listening, feeling for breaths on our cheek and looking down at their chest to see if it was rising. We also had to listen for any choking noises. We learnt that if a person was unconscious but breathing, we should put them into the recovery position. This makes sure that they will not choke should they be sick. Then, we watched a video of someone performing the recovery position and then practised on each other.

Finally, we learnt CPR which means cardiopulmonary resuscitation. CPR is where you do chest compressions to ensure the heart pumps blood around the body and rescue breathes to get oxygen into the lungs. This must not be done on a conscious or breathing casualty as it could cause further injuries.

We were also shown how to use a defibrillator which sends a shock to the heart to restart it if it has stopped beating properly. If you call 999 or 911 they will be able to tell you where the nearest defibrillator is and the code to unlock it. We enjoyed the session very much and learnt a lot about what to do should we come across an incident needing first Alice Wilson
