We have had another excellent week at school with many exciting opportunities for the children. The children have been working hard in class and have also managed to fit in the all important rehearsals for the much anticipated Grandparents' Day on Thursday next week. We are really looking forward to welcoming grandparents into the school for this very special event. We also have our Open Day next Saturday where again everybody has been working hard to show our school to our parents and prospective parents. The children are so proud of our wonderful school and these two occasions give the children a perfect opportunity to showcase it to their families.

This week, we have also had Form 6 complete their Bikeability course. All of the children worked exceptionally hard and were a credit to the school. They even managed to carry on despite the torrential rain at the beginning of the week. We also had Form 4 participate in their first ever overnight residential trip to Danbury Outdoors. FORM 6 - This week all of the children in Form 6 have been taking part in the Bikeability Safer Cycling scheme. The children had to understand how to keep the bicycles in good working order and then demonstrate their safe riding skills on a bicycle, including being able to signal a turn using either hand, safely turning right and left and weaving carefully in and out of obstructions in the road. They had to do all of this before the were allowed to take their bikes onto the road. The children also

had to be able to read and understand several highway signs as they were riding on the road with other road users. The children thoroughly enjoyed taking part and have learnt a great deal about road and cycle safety.

STREET DANCE WORKSHOPS - This week Maldon Court have caught dance fever and have been taking part in some taster Street Dance Classes. Classes introduced the children to core street styles and put them into practice with some exciting choreography. SCIENCE CLUB - What can we say but it has been a messy start to the summer term. We have been investigating the best way to take finger prints and tried pen ink, felt tips, flour, oil, pencil and sellotape. The children were given the equipment and given the brief to investigate the best way to take fingerprints and had great fun trialling different ways with various degrees of success. This week we have started an investigation to be conducted over a few weeks. The investigation is about






hydrogels and how hydrophilic they are. Our investigation started by extracting the hydrogel crystals from a nappy and then adding urine (coloured water) to the crystals to discover how much water the crystals could hold. We were astonished that a toddler size nappy could hold 500ml of liquid. Next week we shall extend our investigation, which could take a number of turns depending on what these budding scientists come up with!

FORM I ASSEMBLY - On Thursday Form I presented their class assembly to the whole school and parents. The assembly was about a story called Handa's Hen that the children acted out. The children created their own books and enjoyed talking about them. Well done to Form I and thank you to the parents for their support with costumes and learning lines.
