SCIENCE WEEK

RECEPTION - Reception have been growing different vegetables in our Vegetable Garden. We have planted a blackberry bush and potatoes. We were surprised to see a seedling growing from the pumpkin seeds that we planted in the Autumn term. We are hoping that with enough water and sunlight, we might be able to grow a pumpkin!




FORM I & 2 combined a science afternoon full of fun and exciting experiments. Their first experiment was to explore forces by making a

paper helicopter and dropping it from a height to see how the air resistance affected the helicopter flight. The second experiment was exploring static electricity, using balloons and tissue paper. The children discovered how they create electrons out of friction and made their tissue paper newt fly. The children were great scientists asking lots of questions Miss Broadbridge and Mrs Dickinson and explaining their reasoning.



FORM 3 - Form 3 have been studying Light and Shadows. They have investigated whether light travels in a straight line by creating mirror mazes; what materials create the best shadows; which surfaces reflect light the best and how they can alter the size and shape of shadows. DT - Form 3 created some super Light Boxes for Mother's Day. They had to construct the box frame using wood and then include an electrical circuit with a switch to illuminate their message. They were rightly proud of their achievements and are looking forward to finding out much more about electricity in Form 4. Mrs Baron



FORM 5 - Form 5 Girls had an excellent day at Felsted celebrating Women in Science. Not only did the children learn about some inspirational female scientists (past and present) they also experienced Biology, Chemistry and Physics in a school Laboratory. In Biology they investigated how varying conditions affected water Daphnia using microscopes, in chemistry they made a pH indicator with red cabbage and used this to identify some unknown liquids and in Physics they had to find the most resistant chocolate bar to withstand breakage on an expedition. In addition, they all enjoyed an enormous canteen lunch in the refectory. Thankyou Mrs Curtis for your help transporting the girls. Mrs Bonner















FORM 6 - In Science this week Form 6 have investigated the process of natural selection on a population of birds called 'Springbeaks' over four seasons of breeding on an isolated environment called 'Clippy Island.' The children simulated feeding in a timed exercise to illustrate how a limited food supply and the introduction of genetic variants can lead to natural selection and adaptation. The class examined whether or not beak size affects the ability of a Springbeak to gather food and how this variation can affect successive generations in the population. This investigation helped the children to understand that species characteristics can change over time and that natural selection is the main process which drives evolution. Mrs Fleming



SCIENCE MUSEUM KS2 - As part of our ongoing Science Week Celebrations we took Forms 3-6 to the Science Museum. The children had a fabulous day exploring various areas and attending the 'lt takes Guts' demonstration which wowed us all and helped the children to understand the true journey of food through the body. We also went to the Explore Lab. The children had an hour to explore almost anything they wanted in the lab.... we had electrical circuits, bridge building, friction slides, marble runs, forces, water photography and shutter speed, gravity, sound, light, probability, thermal imagery: the list goes on. Everyone loved this area and could have spent far longer being hands on and discovering more! Thankyou so much to all staff and parent helpers; without you this exciting trip would not have been possible.
