


DISTRICT SPORTS FIELD EVENTS - On Tuesday 3rd June, Maldon Court took part in the Maldon District Sports Field Events. Six pupils competed in the long jump, high jump and ball throw, one boy and one girl were entered into every event. The atmosphere was incredible, and the competition fierce. Maldon Court performed to an elite level, demonstrating fantastic skill and precision. We were thrilled to be placed 1st in three events and 2nd in three events, making us Maldon District Sports Field Event Champions for 2018. A big thank you to all the parents who came to support us.

The Relay Cup was the culmination of a superb day of competition where both the boys and girls won with at least an 80m win over the four other schools. Wow! It was most certainly worth it, the children are now 2018 Maldon District Field and Track Champions, Relay Champions and Overall Athletics Champions, a truly remarkable achievement.

FORM 5 COMPUTING - In Computing this week Form 3 were learning about the inside of a computer. They were able to take apart one of the base units and identify some of the parts including a RAM, the CPU and the fan. The children were very confident in naming the separate parts and explaining their functions.



FORM 6 SCIENCE - Form 6 had their final session at the Plume this week. This session was based around electricity. To start with the students tested various materials to see if they were electrical conductors or insulators by investigating whether a current would pass through the circuit and enable the lamp to be lit. After this they had to find the best electrical conductor by seeing how brightly the lamp shone. In order to prove their theory as to which material was the best electrical conductor the class then used an ammeter to test the current passing through the object. The better the conductor the higher the reading on the ammeter. The children all achieved great results so were then allowed to perform some electrolysis. Firstly the teacher demonstrated electrolysis of Copper Sulphate to produce copper and sulphur. Then the students used this to perform an investigation to discover how much salt is

FORM 4 SCIENCE – In Science, Form 4 have been experimenting with sound. We made our own string telephones and investigated if they worked better with the string taut or slack. If they could work around corners and if having a knot in the string would make a difference to the sound. We learnt that the sound vibrations were able to travel better when the rope was taut and that sound vibrations can travel through liquids, solids and gases at different speeds.
