We did three activities. First, we all learnt the recovery position. We chose partners to work with, then we had to look around to make sure there was no danger. We then had to put both fingers on our partner's chin and put our ear against their mouth to check that they were breathing. After we had done that, the instructors showed us how to put them into the position. We then swapped over to let our partner have a go.

The next activity was CPR. We were given a dummy and were shown how to do CPR. We had to work really hard to press down on the dummy's chest properly. We also learnt how to do mouth to mouth.

Our final activity was to learn how to treat someone who is choking. The instructors showed us a method that would help for a less serious situation, they then showed us another method for a more serious situation. It was quite difficult but eventually the sweet that the dummy was 'choking' on came out.
