


Dear Parents.



FORM 5 & 6 TRIP TO HARRY POTTER WORLD - On Friday the Form 5 and 6 children had the most fantastic trip to Warner Bros for a tour of the Harry Potter Studios. When we returned, we asked the children to sum up their day in one word and these were a few of their adjectives: astounding, thrilling, unforgettable, inspiring, spectacular and mind blowing. Our day certainly was all of the above. The children were astounded with the amount of detail and work that goes into the making of a film and the tiny attention to detail. We discovered that a skin prosthetic may take 30 days to make and may only be used once. They found out that there are over 4000 individual wands made for the characters in the film and that each wand was originally hand carved until Daniel Radcliff broke 80 wooden wands within the early stages of filming. It was then decided that they would be cast and made from resin. Duplicates were created in case a wand broke, and rubber versions were made for stunt work. The children were also thrilled to discover that Wonder Woman was being filmed in the warehouse next to us. It truly was a magical experience and the children were a credit to the school.
