CHATHAM DOCKS - Forms 2, 5 and 6 had a fantastic day at Chatham Dockyard and would love to go back again. Form 2, started the day with science-based activities. The children had to identify materials and their properties, they certainly impressed with their scientific vocabulary, and then they had to create an object that would float using polymorph. They then moved on to make a boat hull; they had to stick the plastic pattern together to make it waterproof, add a weight and a motor and then race their boats. The final activity involved making a skipping rope and visiting the rope-making building; it was so long they could barely see from one end to the other. Forms 5 and 6 were taken on a tour of the submarine Ocelot and a WWII ship the Calavore. As always, the children were extremely well behaved; they asked and answered questions confidently and sensibly; they worked cooperatively and enthusiastically and were a real credit to themselves and the school.



HARVEST GIFTS - On Wednesday 6th November, Form 6 children went to St Peter's Hospital in Maldon to give Julie Taylor all the Harvest festival donations. St Peter's Hospital help over 100 families in and around Maldon with weekly food parcels. On Christmas Eve, the team at St Peters take hampers for any elderly residence that live on their own with no families. Julie and her team work with the Red Cross and the local community nurses to make all this possible. Julie makes small toys made from wool for a school in Witham with children that are deaf and/or blind. If you have any left over wool you are able to donate, please drop it to the school office.
